1-10 Gestation Stage (unborn)

11-20 Beginning Stage (newborn)

If your Department is just beginning, Good Job! Do not be discouraged! All beginnings take time and a good base is important for a solid construction. You can measure your growth every year.

But, if your Department has 5 years or more, and is still at this stage, just beginning, it would have serious problem in growing and in gaining credibility, unless some urgent changes are made.

20-40 Acquiring Credibility Stage (child)

The Department has made progress but there are still many "battles" to win and overcome.

There may be many spiritual wars trying to stop the advance. You are no longer in the pioneering stage but neither has complete credibility. You should continue to try to win it and people will know about it as a legitimate organization that is there to stay and not something that will disappear.

If you are still in this stage after 10 years, it shows severe problems that must be overcome.

40-60 Growth stage (Teenager)

Still has a long way to go in order to grow, but you are doing it in many areas and possesses the rapidity and the potential to jump to the next stage.

60-80 Consolidation (Young Adult) (At school, you would have a 7 or 8 by being in this stage)

Not only has credibility, it also has a solid structure, allowing you to have foundations for future growth and is anticipating it.

80-100 Respect and Missionary Vision (The Adult becomes a father and is mature at life: reproduces and has Spiritual sons) (At school, you would have a 9 or 10 by being in this stage)

Your Missions Department has good testimony to the congregation and church leadership. Some still do not understand the vision but all "respect" the achievements and progress of the Missions Department, as well as his testimony. It means that not all brothers and sisters have a missionary vision but the church as a body, does.
